TASK 1: Revising and conducting the 2022 survey

BACKGROUND

While the survey needs to stay essentially the same for monitoring over time purposes, there is an opportunity to make small revisions to ensure the survey is as useful as possible to the local community, industry and government. This task also involves interviewing selected key informants from community, government, and industry about potential revisions that may be useful.

TASK OBJECTIVES

1) To obtain ethics approval; 2) To establish technical reference group; 3) To revise the survey questionnaire, where useful and feasible, using interviews and related research data, and 4) to conduct a representative survey of residents in the Narrabri Shire

TASK OUTPUTS AND SPECIFIC DELIVERABLES

- 1. Ethics approved obtained
- 2. Technical reference group established
- 3. A revised survey instrument, while still being comparable to the 2017 survey on all the main dimensions of community wellbeing and social licence to operate.
- 4. A clean and representative dataset for 2022.

5. A factsheet outlining the project.

TASK 2: 2022 data analyses, interim report, and stakeholder communications

BACKGROUND

These interim findings will report on changes between the pre-approval and the continuing appraisal phase (post-approval).

TASK OBJECTIVES

To assess any changes in community wellbeing and attitudes to CSG development after government approvals were given

TASK OUTPUTS AND SPECIFIC DELIVERABLES

- 1. A weighted 2022 dataset for representativeness, which is linked to the 2017 dataset
- 2. An interim report
- 3. A knowledge transfer session and presentation of 2022 interim findings to key community, industry and government stakeholders. This may include a presentation of interim findings in Narrabri (COVID restrictions permitting).
- 4. A factsheet outlining the interim results

PROGRESS REPORT

This project has been delayed three months due to delays collecting the telephone survey data. The telephone survey was initially planned for one month in May 2022, though it was postponed to June 2022 so as not to coincide with the Federal election and telephone polling in the region. The telephone survey commenced in early June 2022 and was planned to be out of the field by the end of June, based on 2017 timeframes. However, since 2017 there has been a marked increase in the percentage of residents unwilling to answer calls from unknown numbers. This industry wide phenomenon meant that our survey was in the field for an additional two months to collect the sample of respondents.

Regarding the four specific deliverables listed in Task 2 above, their progress status is as follows:

1. A 2022 dataset has been weighted and linked to the weighted 2017 dataset. (Completed)

- 2. The main findings have been analysed, though more detailed analysis is continuing. The Interim Report is presently in draft form. We expect this final draft to be finished in February, which will be internally reviewed in March, and released in April 2023 (In progress)
- 3. A presentation of preliminary findings was given to the Narrabri Community Consultative Committee in November 2022 outlining the main findings. Presentations of more detailed findings will be given to key community, industry and government stakeholders are being planned for March and April, 2023. (Partially completed)
- 4. A factsheet outlining the interim results will be drafted after and based on the Interim Report. The factsheet is now planned for release in April 2023 (Not yet started)

The delayed delivery of Task 2 will not impact on Task 3, scheduled for delivery in May 2024.
